



# 2023-2024 Student Health Insurance Plan for University of Maine System

## Who is eligible to enroll?

All undergraduate students taking nine or more credit hours per semester and graduate students taking six or more credit hours per semester may enroll in this plan on a voluntary basis.

The student (Named Insured, as defined in this Certificate) must actively attend classes for at least the first 31 days after the date for which coverage is purchased. Home study, correspondence, and online courses do not fulfill the eligibility requirements that the student actively attend classes. The Company maintains its right to investigate eligibility or student status and attendance records to verify that the Policy eligibility requirements have been met. If and whenever the Company discovers that the Policy eligibility requirements have not been met, its only obligation is refund of premium.

The certificate of coverage provides details of the coverage including benefits, exclusions, and reductions or limitations and the terms under which the coverage may be continued in force. The Deductible will be waived and benefits will be paid at 100% for Covered Medical Expenses incurred after a \$10 Copay per visit when treatment is rendered at the University of Maine Counseling Center; except that the first visit each Plan Year will be paid without cost-sharing.

## Exclusions and Limitations

No benefits will be paid for: a) loss or expense caused by, contributed to, or resulting from; or b) treatment, services or supplies for, at, or related to any of the following:

1. Acne.
2. Addiction, such as:
  - Caffeine addiction.
  - Non-chemical addiction, such as: gambling, sexual, spending, shopping, working and religious.
  - Codependency.

This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in the Benefits for Treatment of Mental Illness and Substance Use Disorder.
3. Biofeedback.
4. Chronic pain disorders.
5. Circumcision.
6. Cosmetic procedures, except as specifically provided in the Policy or reconstructive procedures to:
  - Correct an Injury or treat a Sickness for which benefits are otherwise payable under the Policy. The primary result of the procedure is not a changed or improved physical appearance.
  - Correct port wine stains.
7. Custodial Care.
  - Care provided in: rest homes, health resorts, homes for the aged, halfway houses, college infirmaries or places mainly for domiciliary or Custodial Care.
  - Extended care in treatment or substance abuse facilities for domiciliary or Custodial Care.
8. Dental treatment, except:
  - For accidental Injury to Sound, Natural Teeth.
  - As described under Dental Treatment in the Policy.

This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Dental Services.
9. Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment.
10. Flight in any kind of aircraft, except while riding as a passenger on a regularly scheduled flight of a commercial airline, or chartered aircraft only while participating in a school sponsored activity.
11. Foot care for the following, except as specifically provided in the Policy:
  - Arch supports.
  - Shoe inserts.
  - Supportive devices for the foot.
  - Orthopedic shoes, unless attached to a brace.
  - Support hose.
  - Routine foot care including the care, cutting and removal of corns, calluses, toenails, and bunions (except capsular or bone surgery).

This exclusion does not apply to preventive foot care due to conditions associated with metabolic, neurologic, or peripheral vascular disease.
12. Health spa or similar facilities. Strengthening programs.
13. Hearing examinations. Hearing aids, except as specifically provided under the Benefits for Hearing Aids. Other treatment for hearing defects and hearing loss. "Hearing defects" means any physical defect of the ear which does or can impair normal hearing, apart from the disease process.

This exclusion does not apply to:

  - Hearing defects or hearing loss as a result of an infection or Injury.
14. Hirsutism. Alopecia.
15. Hypnosis.

16. Immunizations, except as specifically provided in the Policy. Preventive medicines or vaccines, except where required for treatment of a covered Injury or as specifically provided in the Policy.
17. Injury or Sickness for which benefits are paid or payable under any Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Law or Act, or similar legislation.
18. Injury sustained by reason of a motor vehicle accident to the extent that benefits are paid or payable by any other valid and collectible insurance.
19. Injury sustained while:
  - Participating in any intercollegiate or professional sport, contest or competition.
  - Traveling to or from such sport, contest or competition as a participant.
  - Participating in any practice or conditioning program for such sport, contest or competition.
20. Investigational services.
21. Lipectomy.
22. Marital or family counseling.
23. Participation in a riot or civil disorder. Commission of or attempt to commit a felony. Fighting.
24. Prescription Drugs, services or supplies as follows, except as specifically provided in the Policy:
  - Therapeutic devices or appliances, including: hypodermic needles, syringes, support garments and other non-medical substances, regardless of intended use, except as specifically provided in the Benefits for Diabetes Treatment.
  - Immunization agents, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - Drugs labeled, "Caution - limited by federal law to investigational use" or experimental drugs, except as specifically provided in the Benefits for Off-Label Drug Use.
  - Products used for cosmetic purposes.
  - Drugs used to treat or cure baldness. Anabolic steroids used for body building.
  - Anorectics - drugs used for the purpose of weight control.
  - Fertility agents or sexual enhancement drugs.
  - Growth hormones.
  - Refills in excess of the number specified or dispensed after one year of date of the prescription.
25. Reproductive services for the following, except as specifically provided in the Policy:
  - Procreative counseling.
  - Genetic counseling and genetic testing.
  - Cryopreservation of reproductive materials. Storage of reproductive materials.
  - Fertility tests.
  - Infertility treatment (male or female), including any services or supplies rendered for the purpose or with the intent of inducing conception.
  - Premarital examinations.
  - Impotence, organic or otherwise.
  - Female sterilization procedures, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - Vasectomy.
  - Reversal of sterilization procedures.
26. Research or examinations relating to research studies, or any treatment for which the patient or the patient's representative must sign an informed consent document identifying the treatment in which the patient is to participate as a research study or clinical research study, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
27. Routine eye examinations. Eye refractions. Eyeglasses. Contact lenses. Prescriptions or fitting of eyeglasses or contact lenses. Vision correction surgery. Treatment for visual defects and problems.  
This exclusion does not apply as follows:
  - When due to a covered Injury or disease process.
  - To benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Vision Services.
  - To one pair of eyeglasses or contact lenses to treat accommodative strabismus, cataracts, or aphakia.
  - To benefits specifically provided in the Policy.
28. Routine Newborn Infant Care and well-baby nursery and related Physician charge, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
29. Preventive care services which are not specifically provided in the Policy, including:
  - Routine physical examinations and routine testing.
  - Preventive testing or treatment.
  - Screening exams or testing in the absence of Injury or Sickness.
30. Services provided normally without charge by the Health Service of the Policyholder. Services covered or provided by the student health fee.
31. Services provided to an Insured with autism spectrum disorders under an individualized education plan or an individualized family service plan.
32. Skeletal irregularities of one or both jaws, including orthognathia and mandibular retrognathia, except reconstructive surgery for mandibular/maxillary orthognathia. Temporomandibular joint dysfunction. Deviated nasal septum,

including submucous resection and/or other surgical correction thereof. Nasal and sinus surgery, except for treatment of a covered Injury or treatment of chronic sinusitis. This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in the Policy.

33. Skydiving. Parachuting. Hang gliding. Glider flying. Parasailing. Sail planing. Bungee jumping.
34. Sleep disorders.
35. Speech therapy, except as specifically provided in the Policy. Naturopathic services.
36. Stand-alone multi-disciplinary smoking cessation programs, except as specifically provided in the Policy. These are programs that usually include health care providers specializing in smoking cessation and may include a psychologist, social worker or other licensed or certified professional.
37. Supplies, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
38. Surgical breast reduction, breast augmentation, breast implants or breast prosthetic devices, or gynecomastia, except:
  - As specifically provided in the Benefits for Breast Cancer Treatment and Reconstructive Breast Surgery.
  - Medically Necessary surgery for gynecomastia.
39. Travel in or upon, sitting in or upon, alighting to or from, or working on or around any:
  - Motorcycle.
  - Recreational vehicle including but not limiting to: two- or three-wheeled motor vehicle, four-wheeled all terrain vehicle (ATV), jet ski, ski cycle, or snowmobile.
40. Treatment in a Government hospital, unless there is a legal obligation for the Insured Person to pay for such treatment.
41. War or any act of war, declared or undeclared; or while in the armed forces of any country (a pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered).
42. Weight management. Weight reduction. Nutrition programs. Treatment for obesity (except morbid obesity for an Insured diagnosed as morbidly obese). Surgery to treat morbid obesity is limited to an intestinal bypass, gastric bypass, or gastroplasty. Surgery for removal of excess skin or fat. This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in the Policy.

## UnitedHealthcare Global: Global Emergency Services

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If you are a student insured with this insurance plan, you are eligible for UnitedHealthcare Global Emergency Services. The requirements to receive these services are as follows:

Domestic Students are eligible for Assistance and Evacuation Benefits when 100 miles or more away from their campus address or 100 miles or more away from their permanent home address or while participating in a study abroad program.

The Assistance and Evacuation Benefits and related services are not meant to be used in lieu of or replace local emergency services such as an ambulance requested through emergency 911 telephone assistance. **All services must be arranged and provided by UnitedHealthcare Global; any services not arranged by UnitedHealthcare Global will not be considered for payment.** If the condition is an emergency, you should go immediately to the nearest physician or hospital without delay and then contact the 24-hour Emergency Response Center. UnitedHealthcare Global will then take the appropriate action to assist you and monitor your care until the situation is resolved.

Key Assistance Benefits include:

- Emergency Evacuation
- Dispatch of Doctors/Specialists
- Medical Repatriation
- Transportation After Stabilization

- Description of the patient's condition;



- Name, location, and telephone number of hospital, if applicable;
- Name and telephone number of the attending physician; and
- Information of where the physician can be immediately reached.

This service is meant to complement your Student Health Center. If possible, we encourage you to visit your SHC first before using this service.

HealthiestYou is not health insurance. HealthiestYou is designed to complement, and not replace, the care you receive from your primary care physician. HealthiestYou physicians are an independent network of doctors who advise, diagnose, and prescribe at their own discretion. HealthiestYou physicians provide cross coverage and operate subject to state regulations. Physicians in the independent network do not prescribe DEA controlled substances, non-therapeutic drugs and certain other drugs which may be harmful because of their potential for abuse. HealthiestYou does not guarantee that a prescription will be written. Services may vary by state.

\*Available to Insured students; age restrictions may apply. If you call prior to the effective date of your coverage under the insurance plan, you will be charged a service fee before being connected to a board-certified physician.

### HealthiestYou: Virtual Counselor Access

Starting on the effective date of your coverage under the student insurance plan, you have access to mental health providers through a national virtual counseling service.\* Psychiatrists, psychologists and licensed therapists are available to you through a variety of communication methods, including phone and video.

When you sign up, you'll complete a questionnaire, choose your provider and select a date and time for your appointment. Appointments are available 7 days a week. Visits are secure, discreet and confidential, and you have ongoing support with the same provider.

As an insured with Student Resources, there is no consultation fee for this service. Every communication with a provider is covered 100% during your policy period.

### 24/7 StudentAssist

Insureds have immediate access to StudentAssist, a service that coordinates care using a network of resources. Services available include:

- 24/7 Crisis Support – access to trained master's level specialists, 24/7/365, who provide in-the-moment support and consultation.
- Financial and Legal Counseling – two 30 minute telephonic consultations with money coaches who offer consultations on issues such as financial planning, credit and collection issues, home buying and renting and
